Ruggero Piano Teacher Merit Award

The Ruggeros have long recognized the value of music in our society. In generous support of the music educators of Raleigh Piano Teachers Association, Richard and Deborah Ruggero have established the —*Ruggero Piano* Teacher Merit Award. The recipient is chosen annually from nominated applicants and receives an award of \$500. The *Ruggero Piano* Teacher Merit Award recognizes an individual teacher who has made a difference in students' lives, has contributed to the advancement of music in their community, and has made significant contributions to RPTA, NCMTA, and/or MTNA. An applicant may be nominated by any RPTA member. The application form along with any supporting documents must be submitted in duplicate to the current RPTA President postmarked by December 31. The following items are examples of the type of documents that should be submitted with the application.
1. Teaching/professional achievements, and number of years teaching experience
2. Evidence of teaching excellence
3. Accomplishments/contributions to RPTA, NCMTA, and/or MTNA
4. Community involvement
5. Former student or parent letter of support
6. Professional colleague letter of support
7. Letter of recommendation from the nominating RPTA member

Thank you to all who completed the program survey online over the summer. I was able to use the results of the survey to help select programs based on all of your interests. We have a variety of exciting programs for the year!

Teresa Sumpter will be presenting in October. She will explore the work of Csikszentmihalyi and his book "Creativity" in her program "The Piano Studio as a Creative Community." If you want to know more about selecting literature for your intermediate level students, be sure to attend Jeanine Skinner's program in November, "Designing a Musical Diet for the Intermediate Student: A study of literature and technique that develop mature performers." In January Sheila Paige, founder of the Piano Wellness Seminar, will speak on "Octaves and Staccatos." Tom Lohr has written a wonderful set of 12 intermediate and early advanced level pieces that he will present to us at the February meeting in his program titled "Numbers in Music." In April Anne Scoggin will be telling us about how to transition students out of method books effectively with her program "Moving Beyond the Method Books: Accelerate your Students' Musical Growth." There is a lot going on this year. There are even some special things planned for the December and May meetings! (Details will be announced at the September meeting.)

We will not have a program speaker for the September meeting. We will have an extended business meeting. This will be an important meeting to attend as there will be a lot of information presented. Having an extended business meeting will allow us the time we need to hear important announcements and details about the many things going on in RPTA. See you all there!

Why Apply for Certification?

Do you enjoy seeing your students learn and grow as musicians? Do you treat your work as a profession and a career? Do you want to be the best teacher you can be? You may benefit from becoming a Nationally Certified Teacher of Music.

The MTNA offers an excellent certification program. Any teacher would benefit from completing the activities, which are accessible but challenging. The assignments themselves may highlight something you really need to improve in your teaching.

The assignments address many facets of piano teaching. Do you know common teaching points? Do you have adequate lighting in your studio? How do your students present themselves at recitals? Could you help them become more polished performers? How efficiently do you use your lesson time? Do you provide motivational events or awards for your students? What's on your policy sheet? All these, and many more are elements of the projects required for certification.

Some of the projects were enjoyable to me, some were interesting, some difficult, but none were a waste of time. I particularly enjoyed videotaping lessons, and have continued to do so now that I'm certified. It is amazing and enlightening (and sometimes embarrassing!) for me to watch myself teach.

I also enjoyed getting my certificate in the mail, the right to use the NCTM letters after my name, and the emblem of certification. When you get certified, you are showing that you are serious about your teaching, and trying to be the best teacher you can for your students. Parents looking for a teacher may consider certification as a criteria.

Treasurer's Report: Melissa Jeffrey's reported \$2,685.24 in the checking account, \$13,539.51 in the money market account, and \$1300 in the certification account. Certification: Kathleen Vockeroth announced a new nationally certified member, Julie Gorka. She has been a Suzuki piano teacher for years. She is the first member of our organization to be certified under the new certification guidelines from MTNA. Julie spoke to the group on her experience of becoming certified. She found the process very helpful in reflecting on her teaching, especially the project where she videotaped her teaching sessions of a student. She felt that the process was well worth the time. She is willing to speak to any of us who are interested and have questions.

Courtesy: Donna Naeser will continue this position through the summer. She hopes to be able to do more than send cards, like providing meals or sending flowers. She read an email that Dottie Buster sent her after receiving a card from RPTA. Alma Sparks's mother passed away recently. Please keep in contact with Donna about any needs that you would like to the group to know about.

Scrapbook: Dee Ann Patton spoke to us about the scrapbook that Faye Ward and she have put together about this past year. It has the yearbook and pretty much everything in it. (It was on display during the luncheon.)

Hospitality: Susan Burnette announced that Keyboard Companion subscriptions need to be renewed in August. Checks for that should be given to Susan prior to August so she can send in the renewals. She is looking for someone to take over this job for next year.

Library: Sharon Haigler and Dianne Thomas sang us a song about an inventory set to the Star Wars tune. They would like for us to check everywhere to see if there are RPTA items that need to be turned in. They are also looking for donations, especially of DVDs, to the RPTA library.

Referral: Ellen Scott is refreshing the referral list on our website. If you no longer need students, please email her and she will take your name off the list.

Nelita True Workshop: Melissa Jeffrey's announced that the brochures/applications for the workshop in September are available on the RPTA website. She also had some at the meeting for those who wanted to turn them in then. She went through the schedule of the event for us. The rate is \$45 before June 30th and \$55 after that date. You can call Diane Blanchard with questions. The details of the master class with Nelita True are still being worked out.

Young Artists: Jeanine Skinner announced that the committee is wrapping up YAA. DVD's of the honors' recitals are still available. She would like to sell 5-7 more, \$15 for one or \$25 for two. For next year, the more students that you enter in YAA, the more time the committee will ask you to devote to the event. Volunteers are wanted to help update the YAA lists this summer. She has extras programs from the Honors' recitals.

Old Business: No old business.

New Business: Margaret Anne announced that the Young Artist Audition dates for next year are on March 2nd and 3rd, 2012. We will not be able to use the studio theatre, which will cause some difficulty with crowd and traffic control. Sky Woo is working on that issue and commented "We will make it work". Confirmation of meeting dates and scholarship dates for next year were pending. Loogwah Kradlack made an announcement about the Carnegie Hall and Royal Conservatory Achievement Program.
